ARNOLD Meeting in Panama, 7-8 June 1964

SUBJECT: Adelaide Padron y Cruz

1. ARNOLD/1 himself raised this matter with me while neither James nor Ferrer were within earshot. Quoting ARNOLD/10, he inquired whether marriage with Subject would be one of the courses for KUBARK to terminate the existing ARNOLD relationship. I emphatically answered in the negative, going over by now well-trodden ground once more and, hopefully, making myself understood.

2. In summary, I stated we hold no views one way or the other about his intent to contract marriage. Our concern was strictly political since we could visualize a number of unpleasant consequences flowing from the event. True or false, certain allegations had been made about Subject's past and there were a goodly number of people prepared to testify to the accuracy of those allegations, among them (I presumed) Subject's ex-husband.
