"Castro Blasts Raids on Cuba, Says U.S. Leaders Im-
periled by Aid to Rebels."

This item was introduced by an editor's note refer-
ring to the fact that Castro had turned up at a
Brazilian Embassy reception Saturday night (7 Sep-
tember) where he had submitted to an impromptu
interview. Harker's account of the interview
reached New York Sunday afternoon.

"Havana (AP) - Prime Minister Fidel Castro said Sat-
urday night: 'U.S. leaders would be in danger if
they helped in any attempt to do away with lead-
ers of Cuba.'"

"Bitterly denouncing what he called recent U.S.
prompted raids on Cuban territory, Castro said: 'We
are prepared to fight them and answer in kind. U.S.
leaders should think that if they are aiding terrorist
plans to eliminate Cuban leaders, they themselves
will not be safe.'"

"...World affairs ... seemed to be entering a more
peaceful climate a few days ago, but now this
trend has changed with attacks."

"The U.S. is always ready to negotiate and make
promises which later it will not honor. This has
happened to promises made during the October
crisis. They have been broken as can be seen with
new attacks.

'But I warn this is leading to a very dangerous situ-
ation that could lead to a worse crisis than Octo-
ber's....'"
